PARTICIPANT BIOS:

Dr. Vianne Timmons (moderator)

President and Vice-Chancellor, University of Regina.



Named one of Canada's Most Powerful Women in 2008, 2009, 2010 and 2011, Dr. Timmons is a nationally and internationally recognized expert in inclusive education and literacy research.

Dr. Timmons has been president and vice-chancellor of the University of Regina since 2008. As the first female university president in Saskatchewan, she has been a strong advocate for the development of women leaders, both in her home province and beyond. She is the driving force behind the Inspiring Leadership Forum, an annual, daylong symposium on women and leadership that attracts more than 500 participants.

Dr. Timmons received the Senior Women Academic Administrators of Canada's 2014 Recognition Award for promoting and supporting diversity in academic institutions. In 2015, the Inter-American Organization for Higher Education presented her with the "Leadership and Influence" award for promoting policies that enhance gender equity.

Dr. Timmons is of Mi'kmaq heritage.

Dr. Malinda S. Smith

Professor, Political Science, University of Alberta



Dr. Smith teaches in the areas of international relations, comparative politics and gender and politics. Her published research engages questions in critical African political economy and terrorism studies, critical race feminism and intersectionality, and equity and higher education. Dr. Smith is the coauthored of *The Equity Myth: Racialization and Indigeneity at Canadian Universities* (UBC Press 2017). She is also the editor of three books, including *Securing Africa: Post 9/11 Discourses on Terrorism* (2010)



and *'Beyond the African Tragedy': Discourses on Development and the Global Economy* (2006); and co-editor of *States of Race: Critical Race Feminism in the 21st Century* (2010), and *Critical Concepts: An Introduction to Politics* (2013).

Dr. Smith serves on the national steering committee for the Critical Race and Anti-Colonial Studies Network, is President of the Academic Women's Association at the University of Alberta and has served as the Chair of the faculty association's equity committee. Nationally she has served as Vice President Equity for the Canadian Federation for the Humanities and Social Sciences, and on the CAUT Racialized Academic Staff Working Group. Dr. Smith is the recipient of a number of awards and honours including the ISA-Canada Distinguished Scholar Award (2018-19), the Viola Desmond Award Honouree (2018), the Equity, Diversity and Inclusion Award at the University of Alberta (2018), the HSBC Community Contributor of the Year Award (2016), the CAUT Equity Award (2015), and the Human Rights Education Recognition Award (2013).

Dr. Frank Deer

Associate Professor and Canada Research Chair in Indigenous Education, University of Manitoba.



Dr. Deer is Kanienkeha'ka from Kahnawake, a community that lies just south of Tiotia'ke in the eastern region of the Haudenosaunee Confederacy. Dr. Deer holds a PhD in Educational Administration from the University of Saskatchewan and is published in the area of Indigenous education. Dr. Deer conducts research on Indigenous language education. Dr. Deer has previously served as a classroom teacher in Northern Manitoba and in the Inner City of Winnipeg.

Dr. Lance T. McCready

Associate Professor; Department of Leadership, Higher and Adult Education; University of Toronto



Dr. McCready's research explores education, health and the well-being of Black men, boys and queer youth in urban communities and schools. He is the author of *Making Space for Diverse Masculinities* published by Peter Lang. Dr. McCready earned his M.A. and Ph.D. in Social and Cultural Studies in



Education from the University of California, Berkeley with Designated Emphasis in Women, Gender and Sexuality Studies. He is the 2018 recipient of the Distinguished Research Scholar Award from the Ontario Education Research Symposium.

Dr. Cindy Hanson,
Associate Professor, Adult Education, University of Regina



Dr. Hanson's research contributions consistently draw attention to community and equity issues. Dr. Hanson's research illustrates participatory and intersectional approaches, most often with communities engaged in non-formal, feminist, Indigenous, and intergenerational learning. She currently holds a SSHRC Insight Grant and is the President the Canadian Research Institute for the Advancement of Women.
